Nelles Manor Museum is operated by Nelles Manor Heritage House,

a non-profit charitable organization.

We present Nelles Manor, a 1798 Georgian style house built by United Empire **Loyalist Robert Nelles** from local materials. The Manor opened as a museum in 2016 and represents the history of the Nelles Family who through their involvement in early government and military service plus their extensive early trade and commerce helped to build Canada as an early Nation. The Manor grounds are also the site of the Engagement at the Forty that took place during the War of 1812 - that may have been an important part in the destiny of Ontario and Canada.

Volunteer Visit to The Stone Shop



On October 15, a few of our volunteers took the opportunity to visit the Stone Shop on Main Street West (Highway 8) in Grimsby. It was built in 1800 by United Empire Loyalist Allan Nixon as a Black Smith Shop. He settled in the area shortly after fighting with Butler's Rangers during the American Revolution, receiving 1200 acres of land for his loyalty.

Allan and his wife Mary died in 1813 due to a typhus outbreak, their son William Nixon took over duties at that time. Another early settler and UEL George Pettit was an employee at the shop.

William was a member of the 4th Lincoln Militia during the War of 1812, so when forced by the American soldiers to shoe their horses he purposely did it improperly causing the horse to become lame.

After the war, the building was bought and sold a few times. The building served many purposes, of course as a blacksmith shop, but also a wagon repair shop, the Grimsby Town Hall, a trading post, a residence, and the Grimsby Historical Society Museum.

Today it serves as a heritage building and a reminder of Grimsby's early history. Thank you to current owners Brent and Charlotta Saigeon for the tour. www.stoneshop.ca

Artefact Showcase



Curved Pewter Plate

This Nelles Manor Museum artifact is a reproduction pewter plate with a decorative curved edge. Pewter is a metal alloy and was commonly used throughout history to make tableware. In the English-speaking world, it was often referred to as "sadware". The origins of this material are unknown, but the oldest piece of pewter yet discovered was found in a 3000-year-old Ancient Egyptian tomb.

This reproduction plate emulates the tableware style popular amongst British aristocrats in the latter half of the 18th century. This time period not only coincides with the creation of the Nelles Manor, it is also the period just before the decline of pewter. Pewter fell out of fashion in the early 19th century, likely as a result of technological advancements in pottery and glassmaking. These innovations gave consumers more options, and it seems that porcelain took over pewter as the preferred tableware material. This is for the best; prior to the 20th century, all pewter was produced with lead and would often leach into food. This was particularly a problem with tomatoes, as the leaching issue was worsened by acidity; so much so that it led to a widely held belief in Europe that tomatoes were poisonous. Don't let this discourage you if you are interested in buying pewter wares! All modern pewter is made without lead and is perfectly safe for everyday use.
