In late May of 1813, a large American force attacked and captured Fort George in Niagara-on-the-Lake (then, just referred to as Niagara). The British Troops retreated through Niagara and rested at the Forty (Grimsby). There were almost 1,600 British forces, and many were encamped on Robert Nelles land. The British then proceeded to Burlington Heights where they initiated the well-known Battle of Stoney Creek.

Recently we provided a series of articles in the local paper outlining just how important Nelles Manor Museum is to our community and in a broader sense to all of Canada. The Manor home is one of the oldest open to the public in Ontario, it is situated on the site of one of the most significant battles of the War of 1812.
