#### NELLES MANOR MUSEUM

Nelles Manor Museum is owned by Nelles Manor Heritage House, a nongovernment, not-forprofit volunteer driven organization.

We present Nelles Manor, a **1798** Georgian style home built over a period of ten years by United Empire Loyalist **Robert Nelles** from local materials.

The Museum also represents the history of the Nelles Family who through their involvement in early government and military service plus their extensive early trade and commerce helped to build Canada as an early Nation.

The site of the home is also the site of a significant battle (the **Engagement at the Forty**) in the **War of 1812** that may have been an important part in the destiny of Ontario and Canada.

Coming up is our opening weekend. Open to public tours for all three days and especially on Saturday May 18 when we have a bake sale and some vendors with the famous butter tarts for sale.

Also, our famous Mother's Day Tea is May 11, only 2 single tickets available.

We are working with local officiates to provide an optional venue for small weddings and people renewing their vows. This would take place in our historic drawing room where many, many early couples were married some 200 or more years ago. Those who wish to have a small service of 10 people or less will have the opportunity to have their service in one of the oldest homes in Ontario.

## DID YOU KNOW?

At Nelles Manor Museum We bring History to Life Nelles Manor wasn't just the home of a major person in Robert Nelles who was a Town Warden, Justice of the Peace, Magistrate, Member of the Legislative Assembly of Upper Canada (4 times) and a Lieutenant-Colonel of the 4<sup>th</sup> Lincoln Militia during the War of 1812, but it was also a centre of the community.

Weddings were performed in the Manor. Meetings of the local Lodge were held here for several years. The Celebration Ball at the end of the War of 1812 was held at the Manor.

There are several references to the fact that many travelers were given accommodation at the house including local travelers, indigenous travelers and British dignitaries all who traveled between York (Toronto), the Six Nations Reserve and Niagara (Niagara-on-the-Lake)

We do know that the Forty (Grimsby) was the headquarters for the British Forces for several weeks after the Battle of the Forty. With the significance of the home, it was likely a part of the British activity.

With the extensive trade by the Nelles families throughout Lower and Upper Canada the home would also have been a center of commerce for the community and the region.
