DID YOU KNOW?

Robert Nelles was a Magistrate and Justice of the Peace.

When there wasn't a minister in the district, Robert would perform local marriages. Documents show that he married **200** couples during his tenure. Many of those would have been in the Manor House. The marriages were performed from September 1796 to September 1823. There was a gap between 1817 and 1822 when the **Reverend William Sampson** (married to Maria Eliza Nelles) performed the marriages, however Reverend Sampson was killed in an accident in 1822. A full list of marriages performed by Robert Nelles is available but some interesting and familiar local names were:

- Simeon Cline and Julia Culp 1805
- Jonathan Pettit and Catherine Beamer 1806
- Charles Biggar and Sarah Pettit 1810
- Amos Strafford and Mary Nelles 1810
- Dennis Woolverton and Catherine Nixon -1810
- Christopher Beamer and Margaret Conkle

All donations to Nelles Manor are tax deductible and a donation receipt for tax purposes will be issued for amounts over \$20 It is worthy of note that **Reverend Sampson** married several members of the Nelles families during his brief tenure. These included Reverend Brook-Bridges, Chaplain to His Majesty's forces to **Elizabeth Nelles**, Grimsby and also **William H. Nelles**, Grand River to Margaret Sophia Clement, Grimsby.

The Garden group continues to work on the property and some of the flowers and plants are showing great seasonal colour. Bushes and shrubs are being relocated to enhance their growth and appearance. The butterfly garden continues to develop.

If you own a home. you know how much work it is to maintain and keep in good order. At Nelles Manor Museum we have a 225-year-old home that was built using 1700 year techniques. In some ways that is very good and in other ways it means there has been 225 years of wear and tear. The Coutts family have over the years put a great deal of work into maintaining and ensuring the home is in good condition. They continue to do so.

However, time and weather are not always helpful in a home. Just as an example of the work done in August by our volunteers, not including our faithful gardeners who attend weekly as mentioned above.

- Maintaining walkways to ensure safety for everyone.
- Painting windows
- Power washing all areas as needed
- Erection of cedar rail fences and new signage
- Back access for stairs and landing were painted
- Hedges trimmed

Recently, a volunteer did some tree work on lower branches. That combined with other work previously done to remove ivy and other growth on a couple of trees left a large pile of brush. It has been cleaned up and organized this weekend. Below are a couple of our garden crew resting after the cleanup. Notice the large pile of bigger brush items and the 11 garden bags of leaves and smaller branches.
