# **DID YOU KNOW?**

# Robert Nelles was elected to the Legislative Assembly of Upper Canada four (4) times.

The 1st Parliament of Upper Canada was opened 17 September 1792. Elections in <u>Upper Canada</u> had been held in **August 1792**. All sessions were held at <u>Navy Hall</u> in Newark, later names as <u>Niagara-on-the-Lake</u>. This parliament was dissolved 1 July 1796.

The first representative for the Durham, York, and 1st Lincoln district was Nathanial Pettit.

Robert was first elected **in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Parliament** in **1801** representing **West York**, **1<sup>st</sup> Lincoln and Haldimand**. The parliament sat in the Parliament Buildings of Upper Canada in York (Toronto) and had four sessions until **1804**. His co-representative for the district was Richard Beasley. It was Richard Beasley's farm that the British occupied prior to the Battle of Stoney Creek.

Robert was re-elected for the **4**<sup>th</sup> **Parliament** representing the same district. He served alongside Soloman Hill who died during the term and who was replaced by Joseph Willcocks.

Joseph Willcocks defected to the American invaders during the War of 1812. A byelection was held and Robert Nelles replaced him in the **6th Parliament** representing the **1<sup>st</sup> Lincoln district**.

Robert was re-elected for the **7**<sup>th</sup> **Parliament** representing the same **1**<sup>st</sup> **Lincoln district**. He served a full term from **1817 – 1820**. All sessions were held at York, Upper Canada at the home of Chief Justice of the Court William Henry Draper.
