# New to our Collection-part 1 - revised

As mentioned previously we have been given several artefacts and reproductions of the early 1800 period to augment the existing items at the Manor. (see comments under On-going activities)

One of the early artefacts we have been given is a pistol. This is a percussion pistol circa 1841.



As shown previously this pistol had originally been described as belonging to a soldier based on a plate on the side, however, on closer examination the name was that of the manufacturer of the lock (firing mechanism). This error was noticed by a supporter who did some wonderful in-depth research.

Markings on the barrel indicate it was made between 1841 and 1855 by Birmingham Gunmakers Company in England.

He identified that there were a few unusual aspects to the piece. One, the barrel gauge is much larger than expected and two, the trigger guard is much larger and ornate than expected and more in keeping with a long gun. Also the brass fitting on the end of the pistol appears not to be original and added subsequently.

### **ON-GOING ACTIVITIES**

While we have been shut down by the pandemic this has not an uneventful time for the Manor. 200-year-old houses don't pay attention to shutdowns. There have been several issues related to the upkeep of the property that need to be attended to, such as the following.

- Water damage from an upper water source had created a flood and water damage in the historic 1788 kitchen ceiling and floor. Due to the shutdown materials were hard to purchase but were finally obtained and repairs and restoration made by Barry Coutts. A plumbing bill ensued.
- 2. There was a plumbing problem in the attic apartment that required repairs to that unit. Plumbing bill ensued.
- The furnace suffered failure in a couple of areas and new several valves needed repair or replacement. Again, all handled by Barry Coutts who knows the system so well.

Also, we had a dilemma about how we display artefacts and items relevant to the period, but not specifically relevant to the home. Our extra space is very limited.

The good news is that after consideration, we decided that the space adjacent to the master bedroom could be used for historical displays and small meetings. This space was part of the 1950's addition when the home was converted to apartments. Over the past month or so, a couple of us have been painting, cleaning, updating and converting this space into useable space for those needs. This will be available for our tours and programs when we expect to open on Victoria Day weekend, all things being equal, and the government permitting such activities. This space will add another aspect to the Manor tours and education programs.
