WELCOME

NELLES MANOR MUSEUM

Nelles Manor Museum is owned by Nelles Manor Heritage House, a nongovernment, not-forprofit volunteer driven organization.

We present Nelles Manor, a **1798** Georgian style home built over a period of ten years by United Empire Loyalist **Robert Nelles** from local materials.

The Museum also represents the history of the Nelles Family who through their involvement in early government and military service plus their extensive early trade and commerce helped to build Canada as an early Nation.

The site of the home is also the site of a significant battle (the **Engagement at the Forty**) in the **War of 1812** that may have been an important part in the destiny of Ontario and Canada.

Looking forward to the end of this month when we will provide a local school group with a tour of our historic home and property. While they can read about our history a tour of this 1798 home will bring that history to life.

We are working with local officiates to provide an optional venue for small weddings and people renewing their vows. This would take place in our historic drawing room where many, many early couples were married some 200 or more years ago. Those who wish to have a small service of 10 people or less will have the opportunity to have their service in one of the oldest homes in Ontario.

We are also grateful for the **Niagara Community Foundation** for their grant which will allow us to have 4 concerts of local artists during **2024** on the front lawn of the Manor this season.

We have booked 4 local artists and artist groups for the concerts. There will be a variety of music for all having a different style of music for each. The first concert will be near the end of June.

The concerts will be sold on an individual basis or as a series. Keep a look in further newsletters for more details

DID YOU KNOW?

The Nelles Family had a major impact on the protection of the Upper Canada area, particularly in Niagara. This service is reflected below for the early years but the Nelles tradition on military service carried on through many generations as also noted at the bottom of the report.

In **1814** Robert Nelles was promoted Lieutenant-Colonel of the 4th regiment. In **1822** he was rewarded with a promotion to Colonel of his regiment. During the **War of 1812** the following members of the Nelles Family served in the various militias.

4th Lincoln – Robert Nelles Lt. Colonel;

Nelles Abraham (**Robert's Brother**) Captain (1797); Major (16Oct1814);

Nelles Henry (**Robert's Son**) Lieutenant (1812); Captain (1Jul1813) Taken prisoner, 25Jul1814. Removed to U.S.A; Nelles William (**Robert's Brother**) Captain (25Jun1802) Slightly wounded at Lundy's Lane, 25Jul1814; Nelles John I. Private

2nd Lincoln – Nelles Warner (Robert's Brother) Lieutenant (1812); Nelles Abraham Private Taken prisoner, 5Jul1814 at Chippawa

5th **Lincoln** – Nelles William Private Taken prisoner, 25Jul1814. Removed to USA.

Robert's son Henry served- at the battle of Queenston Heights and was taken prisoner at Lundy's Lane July 1814

1837 Upper Canada Rebellion

During the rebellion in Upper Canada in **1837** the 4th Lincoln Militia were called into service. Among the officers in the Regiment were several Nelles Family members as noted below with their dates of commission

Col. Robert Nelles - January 12, 1822; Col. Henry Nelles -January 6 1838; (Robert's Son) Captain William Nelles - November 5,1827; Lieut. George M. Nelles -June 7, 1833; Lieut. Robert F. Nelles – August 28 1837. (Robert's Grandson)

1865 – Fenian Raids

Two local companies of militia volunteered for service to respond to the Fenian threats and invasion. One company was Captained by **William B. Nelles**. It is reported each company consisted of 55 men. Included in Capt. Nelles's command were

- ✓ Sgt. Samuel A. Nelles
- ✓ Beverly Nelles
- ✓ Cyrus S. Nelles
- ✓ Walter H. Nelles
- ✓ Ontario A. Nelles

Several generations continued in their service to Canada.

At Nelles Manor Museum We bring History to Life Lieutenant **Colonel C.M. Nelles** commander of the Royal Canadian Dragoons in **World War 1**. Eventually promoted to **Brigadier- General**. His two sons **Norman Cummings Nelles** (killed in France at the age of 21) and **Percy Walker Nelles** (sailor) also served in **World War 1**. Percy Walker Nelles continued to serve and eventually rose to the rank of **Admiral**.
