#### NELLES MANOR MUSEUM

Nelles Manor Museum is owned by Nelles Manor Heritage House, a nongovernment not-for-profit volunteer driven organization.

We present Nelles Manor, a 1798 Georgian style home built over a period of ten years by United Empire Loyalist Robert Nelles from local materials.

The Museum also represents the history of the Nelles Family who through their involvement in early government and military service plus their extensive early trade and commerce helped to build Canada as an early Nation.

The site of the home is also the site of a significant battle in the War of 1812 that may have been an important part in the destiny of Ontario and Canada.

## 2023

### November

November was as a relatively quiet month after all the activity in October with the Harvest Tea and the Murder Mystery. There are hardly words available to express our appreciation for the dedication and commitment of our volunteers who made these events possible. ## DID YOU KNOW?

**Robert Nelles** and his brothers owned several mills on Forty Creek. One of these was a lumber mill. The family shipped lumber and other goods throughout Upper Canada and also to Montreal in Lower Canada.

Examples of these were the following:

1. A shipment by Henry Nelles (Robert's son) and consigned to Messers Gillespie, Moffat and Co. in Montreal showed 1,077 Barrels of Flour, 109 Barrels of Pork, 17 Kegs of Lard, and 6,700 Bushels of Wheat on consignment to three different merchants. Ships docked regularly at the Forty (Grimsby) in these transactions. The was a specific Nelles Pier on Lake Ontario approximately at the foot of what is now Maple Avenue that facilitated these shipments.

- 2. A letter dated **July 1, 1800** shows the shipment of Lumber from Grimsby to Niagara-on-the-Lake to build the courthouse and Navy Hall.
- 3. A letter dated **March 9, 1800** from **Joseph Brant** indicating he was intending to build two small houses and requesting **Robert Nelles** to set aside sufficient lumber to build these houses in the spring.

## Estate Planning

Nelles Manor is one of the few historical properties of original Loyalist built heritage left in Ontario. One of the ways to support the Manor is to include Nelles Manor Heritage House in your estate plans.
